Thursday – 1

Our biggest need this year is to receive enough support to build FEBC's evangelism center in Kiev, the capital of Ukraine. The facility will serve Ukrainian media evangelists for generations, as we use traditional technologies like FM radio stations, as well as new tools that will help us reach millions of young Ukrainians throughout the country. The center will include several studios for recording and broadcasting on multiple platforms, targeting different audiences. Please pray for this need.
