### **Sunday – 1**

We are beginning to broadcast via an FM network of stations in the Siberian region of Tomsk. We will be on the air in several cities, with a combined population of more than 1 million people. Please pray that many will accept Jesus as their personal Savior and serve Him.

### **Tuesday – 3**

Please pray for Oleg Shevkun, FEBC-Russia's senior broadcaster in Moscow. Every Tuesday in a small studio, Oleg sits down with several non-Christian students to read the Bible and talk about their reactions on air. Commenting on the audience and style of the program, Oleg says, "They just want someone to talk with them. That's where we married the Internet with talk radio." Oleg is pursuing our growing Internet audience. Please pray for that.
