Sunday – 1

We are planning an opening ceremony that will include Christian music and preaching the Gospel to people who do not know the Lord. FEBC President Ed Cannon will join Victor to launch this new station. Pray for God's blessings on this celebration. Pray that many people will hear the Good News and commit their lives to Jesus.

Please pray for Rev. Max Shargaev. He says, "Thank you for praying for Ukraine and helping us reach people here!" Please continue to pray for our Ukrainian broadcasters and their families.

Tuesday – 3

We continue to encourage our listeners to adopt or become foster parents in both Russia and Ukraine. There are millions of "social orphans" that need loving families. Please pray that many more will find loving families.

Please pray for the summer Christian camp *Sputnik* in Eastern Ukraine. Many children of our staff from Slavyansk go there to have a good time and develop relationships with each other. Saturday – 14

Please pray for Vladimir Savenkov, our missionary in Ukraine. He and his wife became foster and adoptive parents to six children. Vladimir also serves children who live in orphanages. Sometimes they have an opportunity to listen to FEBC broadcasts. Pray for salvation of these children.

Sunday – 15

Our audience is growing. Our programs are listened to three million times a month. We receive about 1,000 responses a day. Praise the Lord! Please continue to pray that many listeners in Russia and Ukraine will find freedom in Jesus Christ and follow Him.
