



## **FEBC Russian Ministries Prayer Focus November 2015**

### **Sunday – 1**

Please pray for Oleg Bindasov, FEBC station director in Moscow. “Thank you, friends, for helping us bring the Good News to Muscovites and listeners throughout Russia,” says Oleg. Pray that many listeners will commit their lives to Jesus through FEBC’s ministry in Moscow.

### **Monday – 2**

Please pray for Mikhail from St. Petersburg who was scheduled for brain tumor surgery. Pray for a successful operation and for Mikhail’s salvation.

### **Tuesday – 3**

Viktor Kurilenko, FEBC’s director in Slavyansk, asked us to continue to pray for peace in Eastern Ukraine where thousands were killed in the war. “We minister to the Ukrainian people and believe that many of them will come to know the Lord at this difficult time for the country,” says Viktor.

### **Wednesday – 4**

Please pray for Rudi Wiens who is overseeing the development of FEBC’s outreach in Central Asia. Pray for God’s wisdom and blessings in his work, so that many listeners will accept Jesus in this Muslim-dominant region.

### **Thursday – 5**

Please pray for little Dima, 3, from St. Petersburg. He has a brain tumor, and doctors said that surgery is not possible because it is too deep in his brain. Pray that God will heal Dima.
