### **Thursday – 1**

Please pray for Rudi Wiens who is overseeing the development of FEBC's outreach in Central Asia. Please pray that his travel and ministry activities will be the most effective use of his time and resources.

Please pray for Saule from Kazakhstan who lost her oldest son when he was only 31 years old. His heart suddenly stopped. Please pray that God will comfort Saule in these days of grieving. Saule participates in our Kazakh broadcast.

Please pray for Oleg Cherny, FEBC Russian Ministries' administrative director. Pray for God's blessings in his work in Moscow, St. Petersburg, Norilsk and Tambov. Also, pray for his health.

Galina from Lugansk, Eastern Ukraine moved to Khmelnytsk, Western Ukraine because of the war. Here she discovered an FEBC broadcast from Chernivtsy. She loved our programs and decided to go to Chernivtsy to meet the staff. She has seven adult children, and two of them are not Christians. She asked us to pray for their salvation and for peace in Eastern Ukraine. She wants to go back to her home city as soon as possible.

**Wednesday – 14**

Please pray for Rev. Alexey Vlasihin, FEBC-Russia's program director. Alexey works on several programming projects with numerous broadcasters in Moscow, St. Petersburg, and Tambov. He is also working on a family program with his wife, Natalia, who is a counselor. His next project is a series of short sermons that introduce the Good News to non-Christians.

**Thursday – 15**

Stas left his wife, Natalia, with three little children: Dima, 8, Ivan, 6, and Lenya, 3. They live in a partially constructed house that lacks heating. Please pray for this family who live near St. Petersburg. Pray that Natalia's husband will return.

**Friday – 16**

Please pray for Irina Rodukova, FEBC co-worker in Moscow. Irina hosts several programs and manages several projects. One of them is a celebration of our new station, opened in Michurinsk, where Irina grew up. Pray that many people in Michurinsk will give their hearts to Christ.

**Saturday – 17**

"My brother is a Christian and was persecuted in the former Soviet Union for his faith. Because of several years in prison, he became ill. Please pray that God will heal my brother and bless his life. And thank you, friends, for your amazing broadcasts!" Lyudmila from Ukraine.

**Tuesday – 20**

Please pray for soldiers in Lugansk and Donetsk, Eastern Ukraine. We gave them radios, so they can listen to FEBC broadcasts in the war region. Pray that God will open their hearts to His Word and many people will commit their lives to Him.

**Wednesday – 21**

Zhanara from Almaty who is a believer asked us to pray for her 19-year old daughter who left home. Zhanara recently had a fight with her and this drove her away. She is regretting it and worries about her daughter. Please pray that the girl will return home.

**Thursday – 22**
